
Beck and Carusi Music Students Earn Awards at Hershey Competition

Congratulations to Cherry Hill High School East senior Dan Swartz, who received a Bronze Medal in the 2017 USA Physics Olympiad Exam (USAPhO), a competition open to students scoring in the top 10 percent in the competitive F=ma test.

Kudos also to the AP Physics C team, which scored 8th in the state in the New Jersey Science League competition this year. This is a competitive state-wide test; our Cherry Hill East students outscored all of the teams in the South Jersey region and earned a plaque for scoring in the top 10.

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
