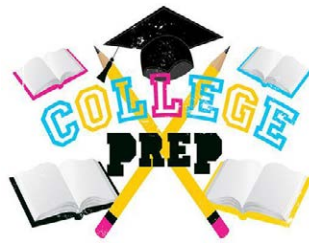
Cherry Hill High School West Student Wins DHS Teen Media Contest

CHPS Elementary and Middle School Musicians Perform in All South Jersey Concerts


