The Cherry Hill African American Civic Association (CHAACA) is in the process of judging entries in its Poster-Essay-Video Contest for students in K-12. Awards will be presented at the February 28 Board of Education Action Meeting. This year's theme was African Americans in the Arts. Submissions were required to depict an African American in the arts before 1960, including the performing arts (music, dance, theater and film), media arts (photography, cinematography) and visual arts (drawing, painting, ceramics, sculpting). I am always amazed by the hard work and creativity demonstrated by our students' entries and look forward seeing to this year's results.

As a former history teacher, avid reader and member of the Board of the Cherry Hill Public Library, I highly recommend that you go to the library, ask about good titles relating to Black History Month, and check out one or two. (You may get a library card on the spot if you don't already have one!) Some of my favorites include *I Love My Hair*, *Shades of Black*, *Beloved*, *Dreams from My Father*, and *I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings*. The cold weather is still upon us – it's the perfect season to curl up with a good book and learn something new!



CHPS Students Nominated to Military Service Academies

On Thursday, Congressman Donald Norcross joined with South Jersey high school students and their families to announce and congratulate the region's 2017 military service academy nominees. Students wishing to attend one of the nation's four military service academy must receive a nomination from his or her representative, senator or the vice president. This year, five students from Cherry Hill High School East were among 28 South Jersey students selected by a committee of community leaders to receive nominations to the Air Force Academy, Military Academy at West Point, Merchant Marine Academy and the Naval Academy.

"These students represent the best of the best of South Jersey," Congressman Norcross said. "They are a credit to our community and our country, and whatever path they choose, I know each of them will go on to do great things."



FAQ: Why is the PARCC Assessment Valuable for My Child?

PARCC testing begins for [high school students on March 28, 2017](#) and for [middle and elementary school students on April 19](#). Schedules vary according grade level and subject. The Cherry Hill Public Schools Assessment Office has put together [an FAQ document to answer common questions about the PARCC assessment process](#). All parents are encouraged to read this FAQ.

Kindergarten Registration Dates and Middle School Open Enrollment Materials Now Available

Kindergarten/first grade registration for children entering public school for the first time begins on March 7, 2017 at the Malberg Administration Building, 45 Ranoldo Terrace. **Children must be 5 years old by October 1, 2017 to be eligible for kindergarten.** It is not necessary to bring your child to register.
