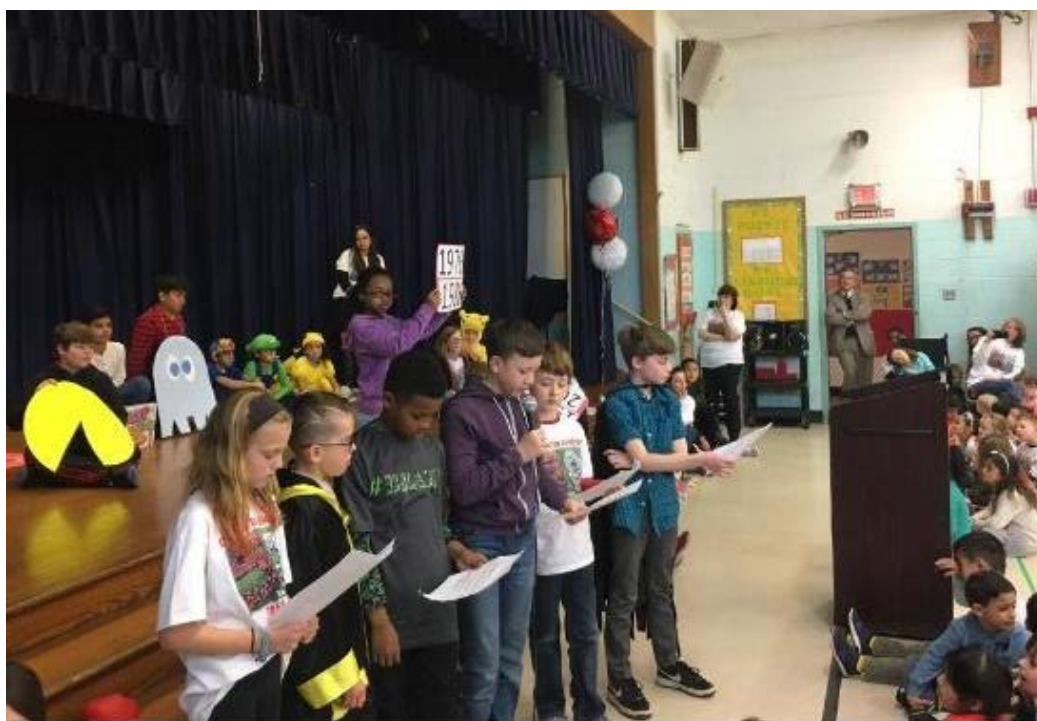

When Celebrating and Learning Go Hand in Hand

Everyone loves a celebration. In the Cherry Hill Public Schools, we seize opportunities to turn learning into celebrations, and celebrations into catalysts for learning.

Happy St. Patrick's Day! As I was out and about in the District today, I noticed many of our faculty, staff and students celebrating the day by wearing green – and many classes at the elementary level celebrated the day with lessons on Irish traditions, folk lore and even dance. We've been fortunate this week to have many things to celebrate – and our students reaped the benefits not only of the joy of a good celebration, but of the learning that led them there and will stay with them long after the events are over.

On Monday, March 13, Clara Barton Elementary School threw a school-wide "50th Birthday Party" to mark the 50 years since the school first opened. All of the students, from kindergarten through 5th grade, celebrated the milestone with age-appropriate activities designed not only for fun, but for learning as well. The entire school gathered for an assembly featuring 5th graders who spoke about each decade – beginning in 1966 – leading up to the present day. Pictured above, the presenters spoke about the music, movies, inventions and famous moments of the past 50 years as other students, many in costume, acted out the events. The students' energy and enthusiasm for their school, and their pride in the work they put into the celebration, were inspiring to witness.

Doctorow, the author of *Ragtime*, the novel. Mr. Drew Cohen, president of MTI, presented the East community with MTI's Courage in Theatre award. Founded in 2007, the award is not given annually; rather, it is presented when an arts organization has, as MTI describes, "confronted challenges that threaten their ability to explore or express their artistic vision in positive ways, even if it means taking an unpopular stance."

It has been incredibly gratifying to see how our community has come together during the tumultuous process of bringing the production to life. The work of our teachers, administrators and students to conduct an open, honest and respectful dialog – and to keep that dialog alive after the show closes this Sunday – is what caught MTI's attention and inspired them to award the East community for its efforts. [The special guests at Thursday's show were unanimously impressed by the production itself, as well.](#) Most important, we all, as an educational community and as a larger community in Cherry Hill, have renewed our commitment to continue learning about and talking through the challenges we all face as such a diverse population. We are dedicated to supporting and understanding one another.
