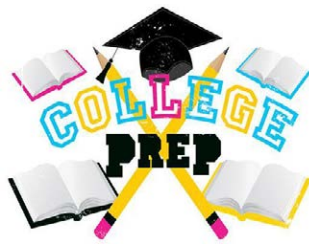


## Free Common App/Naviance Workshops Offered at East and West This Summer
