Dear Woodcrest Elementary School Community,

Our school system is committed to protecting student, teacher, and staff health. To protect our community and be in compliance with the Department of Education regulations, the Cherry Hill School District tested our schools' drinking water for lead.

In accordance with the NJ Department of Education regulations, Cherry Hill School District will implement immediate remedial measures for any drinking water outlet with a result greater than the Lead Action Level of 15 $\mu\text{g}/\text{l}$ (parts per billion [PPB]). This includes turning off the outlet unless it is determined the location must remain on for non-drinking purposes. In these cases, a "DO NOT DRINK – SAFE FOR HANDWASHING ONLY" sign will be posted.

Results of our Testing

Following guidance provided by the EPA, we completed a limited plumbing profile for each of the buildings within the Cherry Hill School District. Through this effort, we identified and tested all drinking water and food preparation outlets. Additional testing was implemented on 12/28/16 to test outlets that were previously unable to be sampled. One (1) additional sample was collected from Woodcrest Elementary School, the one sample tested above the Lead Action Level.

The table below identifies the drinking water outlets that tested above the 15 PPB for lead, the actual lead level, and what temporary remedial action the Cherry Hill School District has taken to reduce the levels of lead at these locations.

Bubbler fountain in room 6	24.8	Immediately took fixture out of service
