of the United Nations, to be [United Nations Day](#). Although this day is not widely celebrated as a day off from work or school, we would like to acknowledge the United Nations' work. It may surprise you to know that the Cherry Hill Public Schools have ties to the United Nations as well.

For the last 10 years, Cherry Hill High School East has held an annual Model United Nations (MUN) conference each April. In 2014, eight area high schools participated in this valuable, hands-on learning experience about global cooperation.

During the conference, students form seven committees, each of which discusses a relevant topic. At the 2014 conference, the topics were UN Office on Drugs and Crime: Human Trafficking in Southeast Asia; UN Human Rights Council: LGBT Rights; UN Population Fund: AIDS Prevention; African Union: Peace to Combat Poverty; Ministry of Magic: Treatment of Muggles and Muggleborns; Joint Domestic Committee: Senate: Immigration Reform; and Joint Domestic Committee: White House: Immigration Reform. Each committee works to create resolutions. At the end of the day, each committee votes on its resolutions. Multiple resolutions can be passed if the majority votes on them. Not only do our students participate in the Model United Nations, but one student from Cherry Hill West served on a panel at the 2014 #C4CT Concussion Awareness Summit at the United Nations Headquarters in New York. Last January, Alycia Jensen ('14) joined a professional athlete panel — including former NFL defensive end and three-time Super Bowl champion Charles Mann and former LA Galaxy soccer forward Alecko Eskandarian — to speak about her challenges with Post-Concussion Syndrome.
